

## Crosswalks

**What constitutes when a driver can turn if there is a pedestrian present in the crosswalk and the roadway is divided?** Pedestrians have safety zones. On a divided road these are usually from sidewalk to median, then from median to sidewalk. On an undivided road these are usually defined as sidewalk to sidewalk. It does not matter whether the driver has adequate time to turn before the pedestrian can get all the way across. They have the right to cross safely from zone to zone. Be cautious of people crossing without a crosswalk in place. (See NRS 484B.280 & 484B.283)

**What are the rules regarding someone with a bicycle in the crosswalk?** Actually, that depends on what the individual is doing with the bicycle while in the crosswalk. If it is being ridden, then the operator should be following the rules of any driver on the road, such as riding with traffic or crossing only on a green light, etc. If the operator is walking the bicycle across the crosswalk, then they are acting as a pedestrian and should be treated as such.
